At the Peace River Municipal Library – FAQ

1) When does it run?

- a) This program runs throughout July and August. Sessions are once a week.
 - i) Kids aged 4 to 6 come on Thursdays from 1:30 to 3:00pm, starting July 7th and ending August 18th.
 - ii) Kids aged 7 to 12 come on Wednesdays from 1:00 to 3:00pm, starting July 6th and ending August 24th.

2) How much does it cost?

- a) This year we are offering the SRC as a free program.

3) Do I need to stay with my child?

- a) Children aged 4 to 6 require an adult (16+) to stay with them. Children 7 and over can be left at the library provided they have all required registration forms filled out.

4) Is there a party this year?

- a) We are planning the Summer Reading Club party for August 20th from 1:00 to 3:00pm. All registered SRC participants are invited to come with an adult.

5) What should my child wear?

- a) Please wear play clothes that can get dirty and possibly stained. Life can get messy at the Library!

6) Sessions have already started! Can I still register my child?

- a) You sure can! Kids can register and join in at any time before the final sessions.

7) We are going to be away for part of the summer, can my child still participate?

- a) Certainly! Your child does not need to attend every session. We do ask that you let us know when your child will be away so that we can prepare accordingly to the numbers we are expecting that week.

8) What if we can't make it to any sessions?

- a) There is the option to register just for the Reading Log. Your child can then bring in his/her log and show it to someone at the Circulation Desk to get stickers and prizes throughout the summer.

9) My niece is visiting for the week. Can she come with my child?

- a) She is welcome to attend as long as her parent/guardian fills out the registration form.

10) Are any other community organizations involved this year?

- a) Actually there are many. **Peace Parent Link** will be running sessions for 4 to 6 year olds every Thursday. We will have local groups to deliver presentations and lead activities with the 7-12 year olds for part of their session each week.
