We currently have two computers available for public use by appointment. Patrons may book one 45-minute session per day.

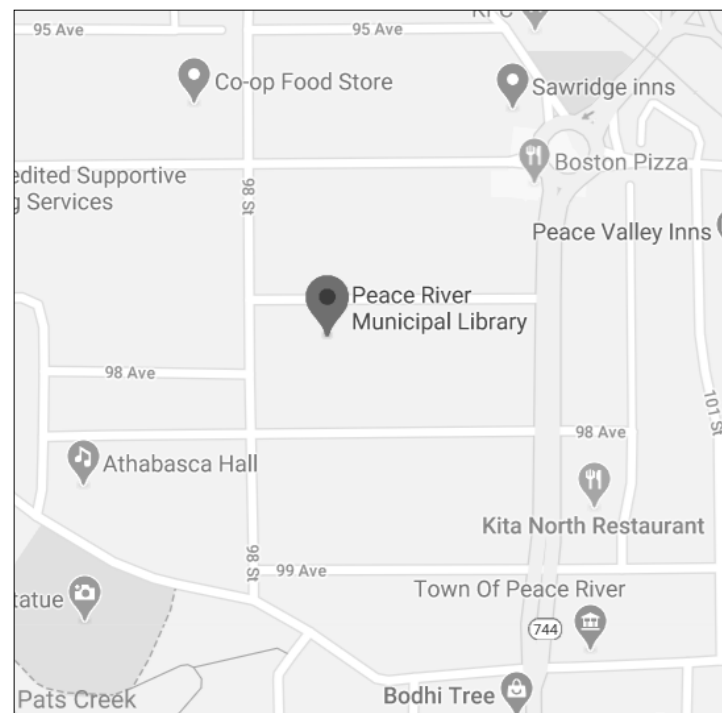
You do not need to have a library card to use the computers.

Returning Items to the Library

Just a reminder that ALL material returned to the library has to go through the Book Drop just outside the front door. (Yes, that means audiobooks and DVDs too!) This lets us isolate items for the required four days and keep our staff and patrons safe.

The four day isolation also means that items may not be checked in for up to a week after you drop your item off. You will continue to get notifications during this time. Rest assured that when the item is checked in, any charges assigned due to the delay will be waived.

If the Book Drop is full and we are closed please come back the next day and drop off your item. If we are open, please let us know that it needs to be changed and we will take care of it.

Interlibrary Loans

We are now able to bring items in for you from other TRAC libraries. You can place your request through www.tracpac.ab.ca with your barcode number and PIN or give us a call.
